Is Hope Lost?

Life boils down to two emotions vying for possession of our souls. We're either carried by the winds of joy into newness of life or we are engulfed in a prison of sorrow where nothing ever changes. Joy is the fruit of the Spirit (Gal. 5:22). Sorrow is the cancer of the soul (Psa. 119:28; Prov. 15:13).

Because of their connection to righteousness (joy) and sin (sorrow), most of us try hard not to let any sorrow show. But it's always there, just under the surface. Hurt, loss, and disappointment are all offsprings of sorrow and reminders that no matter how "saved" we are, we are not in control. Though our God is Light we are just as prone to the ever-encompassing darkness sorrow brings to everyone. This fallen world does not desist from its attempts to rob, steal, and destroy when we become citizens of the kingdom of heaven. The words of singer/songwriter Paul Simon seem quite apropos "Hello darkness my old friend, I've come to talk with you again."

When God put the vision of the Suffering Servant into the mind and heart of the prophet Isaiah He didn't show the prophet a picture of a beast of burden (such as a mule or pack horse). Before Isaiah ever wrote a word about a lamb, he wrote of a man so immersed in sorrow that people had a hard time even looking at Him. You've been there haven't you? You can't look into the face of the father who just lost his beautiful daughter. It doesn't matter how he lost her. Accident, cancer, murder...they all produce an indescribable sorrow that is hard to acknowledge.

Isaiah foretold of the hope of heaven through the forgiveness of sin and the hope of joy replacing sorrow through the act of Christ's offering on the cross. Though we have been forgiven of sin through faith in the cross we still commit it. Is hope lost? No. Because "we have an advocate with the Father, Jesus Christ the righteous" (1 John 2:1). He is faithful to forgive our sins (if we confess them) even though He crushed sin on the cross. Even though He bore our grief and sorrow on the cross we still live in a fallen and sinful world that displaces our Godgiven joy. The same Advocate who "cleanses us from all sin" (1 John 1:7) will also restore to you the joy of your salvation, and uphold you with a willing spirit.
