Responding To The Cross

When we look at the Cross we see the most expensive gift ever given us: God's grace. It is free to us, but it cost God's Son his life. Jesus paid the penalty for sin when He died on the Cross. He broke the power of sin, so we have the power to change the hurts, habits, and hang-ups that keep us from God's purpose in our lives. The cross changed everything.

So, how should I feel when I realize what Jesus did on the cross for me? Guilty? No, Jesus paid for your sin. You don't need to feel guilt. Grief? No, Jesus didn't stay dead. The Bible is clear He rose again. We don't serve a dead Savior.

With that in mind, how should I respond to The Cross? The Bible gives us three reminders of how to respond to what Jesus did for us on the cross.

Make your life count. "Don't you see that you can't live however you please, squandering what God paid such a high price for? The physical part of you is not some piece of property belonging to the spiritual part of you. God owns the whole works. So let people see God in and through your body" (1 Corinthians 6:19-20 MSG).

You can't understand the grace of God and continue living the same way you've always lived. You can't ignore His commands. You can't spend your time on what's trivial and spend your money frivolously. You have been bought with a price: the death of God's Son. You were spared for a purpose and God wants you to fulfill it.

Give Generously "You are familiar with the generosity of our Master, Jesus Christ. Rich as he was, he gave it all away for us—in one stroke he became poor and we became rich" (2 Corinthians 8:9 MSG). Measuring how much you understand God's grace is as easy as looking at your giving. Being lovingly generous to others and to God is the ultimate proof you understand the grace Jesus showed on The Cross.

Share the Good News of Jesus. "The most important thing is that I complete my mission, the work that the Lord Jesus gave me—to tell people the Good News about God's grace" (Acts 20:24 NCV). Once you become a follower of Jesus, part of your life mission is to tell other people about Him. Jesus died for every single person on our planet.
